#### Being Faithful in Grace

In our Sunday morning worship services from September 24 to November 19<sup>th</sup> we will be focusing on the theme, "Being Faithful in Grace". While the Scriptural readings every Sunday vary in their particular teaching, a stream that runs through them is God's loving grace to us – that transforms us – inviting our faithfulness in reflecting his Kingdom in our daily lives. In Matthew 10:8, we read the words of Jesus: "Freely you have received, freely give." Another way of considering what it means for us to be faithful in the grace we've received is described by the British, Anglican theologian, N.T. Wright this way: "the task of Christians in a postmodern world is to be the re-embodiment of Jesus". May all of us be open to the leading of the Spirit in being faithful in grace in these coming months.

As we journey through these weeks, let's ask ourselves:

- 1. What does it mean for me to be faithful in the grace I have and continue to receive from God?
- 2. What does it mean for Grace Church to be faithful in our witness to God's grace in our communities?

Let's be praying for each other in this time.

# **Prayer and Anointing with Oil**

One of the privileges of participating in the life of the church is knowing we have brothers and sisters who will support us in our spiritual journey and the struggles of life. It's comforting, as we face hardship and illness of any kind, to know we can ask for prayer from our church family and pastoral team. One approach to prayer that Christians have practiced over the centuries is to anoint with oil as we pray for someone with illness. In James 5:14 we read, "Are any among you sick? They should call the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord." We read in the Mennonite Church Minister's Manual: "Anointing with oil is not something magical, but is a tangible way of speaking to the sick person of the love of Christ, the presence of the Holy Spirit, and the solidarity of the congregation." This practice is often done in someone's home, but it can also happen in brief prayer service in the church. If you would find this prayer ministry helpful, or if anyone has any questions, please let one of the pastoral team know and we will be glad to follow up with you.

# A Moment for MCC ~ Last year, MCC shipped 9,208 dignity kits to Guatemala, Haiti, Malawi, South Sudan and Zambia.

Students like Mer Puok sew dignity kit base units in the sewing class in Loreto secondary school, an MCC partner in South Sudan. These base units are part of the reusable product system provided in the MCC-supplied dignity kits.

For the female students at Loreto Rumbek, MCC dignity kits are incredibly valuable. Store-bought products are prohibitively expensive and often hard to access, but the reusable products in the kits mean girls and women don't have to waste money on unsustainable solutions. The other items included in the dignity kit, like the soap and comb, are valuable personal hygiene items that are also expensive and hard to find. Even the bucket the kit comes in becomes a valuable storage container.

# **World Communion Sunday Litany**

World Communion Sunday helps us look beyond our local and denominational church boundaries and focus on the unity we have in Christ with all other Christians around the world. In participating in the Lord's Table this morning, we are called to claim and proclaim our God-given unity in Christ, who is the host at ALL our communion tables. We celebrate the greatness of our God, the largeness of the body of Christ, and the enormous gift that God gave us when he sent Jesus to earth. As we stand in awe of the great mystery that the God of all creation wants to be in relationship with humankind, we respond with delight and obedience. All of us may come this morning as we open ourselves to this mystery of God's gracious presence.

# We Confess Our Faith and Need of God's Forgiveness

**Leader:** Let us confess our faith together. **All:** We believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. We believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary. suffered under Pontius Pilate. was crucified, died, and was buried: he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven. he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church. the communion of saints. the forgiveness of sins. the resurrection of the body. and the life everlasting.

**Leader:** Trusting in God's grace, let us confess our need of God's forgiveness.

**All:** Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

**Leader:** Anyone who is in Christ is a new creation, The old life has gone; a new life has begun. In the name of Jesus, we are forgiven, loved, and free.

#### **Prayer**

Loving God, we give thanks for the joy of joining with believers across the world in coming to your table.

Thank you, Lord, for the people you invite to this table, brothers and sisters in Christ.

Together, we come to this table, knowing that you created us and love us.

Together, we come to this table, knowing that Jesus died for us all. We come to this table, knowing that God's Spirit sustains us all. Together, we come to this table, to experience the mystery of our faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. As we come to the table, grace us with your Holy Spirit so that we can understand the wideness of your love. Across time and around the world, we are one people, one body, your Church in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

#### Words of Institution

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you: do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Please take a cup from the pew holder near to you. (Please wait to partake until we are able to do so together.) Prayer for the Cup.

**Leader:** The blood of Christ shed for you.

(We drink the cup together.)
