Pastoral Care Chaplain's Corner: Monstro the Goldfish – from Our Daily Bread

(I love this story. My husband Laur and I once rescued an old goldfish we called "One Eyed Jack.")

Lacey Scott was at her local pet store when a sad fish at the bottom of the tank caught her eye. His scales had turned black and lesions had formed on his body. Lacey rescued the ten-year-old fish,

named him "Monstro" after the whale in the fairytale *Pinocchio*, and placed him in a "hospital" tank, changing his water daily. Slowly, Monstro improved, began to swim, and grew in size. His black scales transformed to gold. Through Lacey's committed care, Monstro was made new!

What Lacey did for a dying goldfish, we can do for people in need around us. Homeless, unemployed, disabled, and lonely "neighbors" lie in our path. Let us allow their sadness to catch our eyes and draw us to respond with neighborly care. A kind greeting. A shared meal. A few dollars donated. An offer to do an errand. How might God use us to offer His love to others, a love which can make all things new?

A Moment for MCC! Becoming Beautiful Trees -Preschool program for refugees in Uganda grounds students with love

The students at Planning for Tomorrow (P4T) Nursery and Primary School, preschool through grade seven, are refugees. Their families have fled violence in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and crossed the border into Uganda to find safety and food in Kyangwali Refugee Settlement. The children, who mainly speak Swahili, need to learn English because it is the primary language in Uganda.

When Linda Espenshade visited in February with freelance photographer, Matthew Lester, schools had just reopened a few weeks earlier. (The Ugandan government closed schools to prevent the spread of COVID-19.) They were there to gather stories and photos for Mennonite Central Committee, which supports P4T's two preschool programs — P4T school and New Hope Nursery and Primary School.

"Children love it here," says Daniel Ameny, executive director of P4T, which is not only the name of the school, but also the Ugandan non-profit, P4T Youth Organization, which Ameny helped to start. As a refugee himself, Ameny is committed to using his compassion and university degree to empower his neighbours.
